

OUR COAST IS UNDER THREAT FROM PLANS TO BUILD THE WORLD'S BIGGEST WIND POWER SITE NEAR THE ISLE OF WIGHT AND PURBECK.

The proposal, by a Dutch/French consortium, will see as many as **200 wind turbines**, up to 200 metres tall, towering over beaches and cliffs and threatening boating and bird life. These giant turbines would blight the beautiful coastal views enjoyed by residents and visitors alike.

This massive and unnecessary industrial development would be **big** and **close**, only 9 miles from the UNESCO World Heritage Site at Swanage, making it highly intrusive visually. Other offshore wind farms are much smaller and further out to sea.

Help us to protect this uniquely beautiful and environmentally sensitive stretch of coastline for all to enjoy.
